


<u>Message From the President</u>

After the service we walked about 1 k to the Digger monument where a second service was conducted and then returned to the village hall where the local community supplied us with an abundance of wine and beer, and for the impatient, like myself the pub (Le Canberra) next door was open all day.

For those unaware, Bullecourt on the Hindenberg line was breached in the spring of 1917 by the Australians, the only troops to do so in the offensive and at great cost. The village of Bullecourt as with many villages in the area still hold a great admiration for Australians.






<u>Above</u>: The three Gonfalons/Banners at the Garrison Church. <u>Below</u>: Members behind the Banner at the March.






