LOW COST INTERNET SERVICES FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES, THE AGED AND VETERANS HOLDING PENSION CARDS.

The TADAust Connect ISP service was launched on the 20th May 2005 as an exclusive service for People with Disabilities, the Aged and Veterans who hold pension cards. The service was launched in the ACT by Senator Gary Humphries and Minister John Hargreaves of the ACT Government who both recognised that the service would be of significant benefit to the Pension Community at large.

The initiative comes from Technical Aid to the Disabled Australia (ACT) or (TADACT) under the national body Technical Aid to the Disabled Australia (TADAust) The service is called TADAust Connect and is available Australia wide.

TADAust Connect provides a Dial Up service for \$5.50 per month with a once off Connection Fee of \$12.00. The \$5.50 cost per month provides; Unlimited Downloads; One Free Email Account; Unlimited time on the Internet. But note that this comes in 4 hour sessions. I.e. on for 4 hours then off; then on again for 4 hours for as many times you like without penalty.

Local call connect for 93% of Australia. (If you live in a remote location, you should call Telstra on 13 22 00 to establish that the exchange serving you does recognise the TADAust Connect Phone Number of 0198308020 as a local call.)

TADAust Connect recognised that the ability of pensioners of any category found it hard to meet the costs of Commercial ISP fees, and arranged this low cost Dial Up service to allow pensioners to connect to the digital world without a incurring a cost burden.

TADAust Connect is part of the Technical Aid to the Disabled organisation around Australia that are not for profit organisation relying on Volunteers. The technology used by TADAust Connect is equal to that of other ISP's, but we might take a little longer to respond to enquiries. Support is a different matter. TADAust Connect has established a competent Technical Support team and can respond to calls or messages in the same day.

PEARLS FROM VICTORIA

STORIES FROM VIETNAM - REFLECTIONS




