



DEDICATION MEMORIAL CEREMONY <u>For</u> <u>LCPL ROSS CHARLES McMILLAN and PTE TREVOR JAMES</u> <u>ATTWOOD</u> <u>HELD at URALLA, NSW 2nd & 3rd FEBRUARY 2008</u>

Over the weekend 2nd/3rd February, (as advised in the 3/2007 Seven News) a ceremony was held to dedicate a Memorial for two of our fallen comrades, from the town of Uralla, in North Western NSW. The ceremony was held at 3.00pm on Sat 2 Feb, 40 years to the day when Ross McMillan was killed during operation Coburg, Ross was a member of 7Platoon C Coy. Trevor Attwood served with 7RAR from 9 Oct 1970 until 9 Feb 1971 when he was posted to 1ARU, he was Killed in Action on 12 Jun 1971 with D & E Platoon.

As a preliminary those attending gathered at the local Bowling Club for a spot of lunch and a convivial drink before the dedication. To everyone's amazement the numbers gathered for the dedication far exceeded everyone's anticipation, around one hundred and fifty at a quick count. The Perimeter, in the infantry, is a circle of men. It is half a section, platoon or company. One half is on guard, staying vigilant, watching for the enemy while the other half rests, sleeps and carries on with life as it is. They are more than just men; they are a brotherhood in uniform.

They share their plans, dreams and hopes with each other. In hard times they share their sadness, fears and pain. They face the enemy together, some like brothers, others like fathers and sons, and always are true friends. They find a spirit in each other that binds them to one another in a bond that lasts forever.

As time passes, they will leave the services and each other. They will travel many different paths of life, some to prosper and others not so well. Somewhere in life's travels, these men find themselves lost in the world, confused, dazed, scared, unhappy and searching for something: something they are not even sure exists.

They are not soldiers any more, they are called veterans.

Somehow in their search, they once again find others like themselves. They find brothers of

the past, brothers of the Perimeter, that circle of safety, where someone else shared their pain, their confusion and their fear. That perimeter where that fear is eased, where there is less confusion. They share each others pain in stories, in tears and in silence. Inside the Perimeter, eye contact can say it all. The Perimeter is a circle of life and a circle of death; it is a circle of wounded warriors, with wounds of both flesh and spirit. This Perimeter is a circle of iron that has never broken. It is a circle of common duty that knows no colour, no creed and no religious ground. The circle will last forever, through the best of times and through the worst of times.

The Perimeter is a place warriors will always seek—even for eternity. Just gaze at our national cemeteries. For out there on the outer edge, ever so vigilant, are those on the perimeter.



On the 30th November 2007, a few of 5PL BCOY (1st tour) got together for a drink or many at the R.S.L club in Highett Victoria. Why because Michael Berrigan (3 Balls) and myself Michael Logan (Father Logan) ended our tour of Vietnam at or around 2.30pm on the same date in 1967, owing to a bit of friendly fire from NZ arty. (Doesn't hurt as much as enemy fire) we were medivac To field hospital.

Mick (3 Balls) was flown to Japan for micro surgery he was there for almost 10 days and then back to Nam. On the 21st December 1967 we arrived at Richman (RAAF) air base, I went to Concord Repat hospital (Sydney) and 3 Balls went on to Victoria. 3 Balls was never to return home to his family because of brain damage, the treatment he received in the first twenty years was of poor quality. He is now in a nursing home in Highett (Victoria) where he receives very good care, he is now getting out a lot for lunch and a drink on Mondays with his carers and a few of the other men from 7 RAR mostly 5PL. And that is a brief story of 3 Balls forty years on, Jono Johnson with good contacts Was able to get hold of Micks Medals and had them mounted for him (see pictures).








